Stormwater Update

he Barton Stormwater Facility has begun water quality monitoring, which is one of the final phases of the project. The monitoring will sample the incoming stormwater flows for pollutants and sample the discharge stormwater flows for the removal of pollutants.

This project has given the city a large number of credits through the EPA and FDEP programs for Total Maximum Daily Loads (TMDL's) that discharge to the Indian River Lagoon. The city obtained a FDEP 319(H) grant fund to achieve the Quality Assurance Project Plan (QAPP) along with matching funds from the Stormwater Utility. The monitoring is expected to be completed within eighteen to twenty-four months, depending on rainfall events.

City Honors Orville Susong

If you are not yet acquainted with "Orville", chances are that you are new to the area or have vaguely associated the name with a popular brand of popcorn. Orville is not the popcorn guy, but he is the community go-to guy for all things Rockledge Little League – among a myriad of other topics.

And so it goes that after more than 18 years of volunteer service to Rockledge Little League Baseball & Softball in almost every available capacity, and having held several positions on the Rockledge Little League Board of Directors, Orville has been honored with a permanent and visible representation of his service. Building Permits

pring is on its way and many citizens of Rockledge are planning home improvement projects. With that in mind, the Rockledge Building Division would like to remind everyone that before you start these projects, it's best to check with the Building Division to ensure that the plans for these improvements will meet the requirements for the City of Rockledge code, as well as the Florida Building Code. Also, we want to remind you that the following projects require a building permit:

- Replacing/adding a fence
- Re-roofing your home
- Building or replacing a shed or carport
- Pouring a driveway
- Making a sewer repair
- Replacing heating/air conditioning
- Adding/replacing gas water heater
- Making an electrical upgrade
- Any structural, electrical, HVAC, plumbing, or gas addition or repair

Garage Sale Information

Whith the nice weather coming our way, many of you may have questions regarding the regulations that apply when having a garage sale. It is understood that garage sales are somewhat a way of American life and they are permitted in the City of Rockledge. If you have any questions regarding garage sales, contact Maddie Curtis, Code Enforcement Officer, at 690-3984. The most important requirements are as follows:



- No more than four garage sales per year, per residence, and not more than one in any 30-day period.
- Limited to two signs (three square feet in surface area) not greater than three feet off the ground.
- Garage sales are limited to no more than three consecutive days and all signage must be removed by 6 p.m. on the final day.
- We permit NO SIGNAGE in the road right-of-way of Fiske Boulevard, Barton Boulevard,
 U.S. 1, Eyster Boulevard, Barnes Boulevard, Florida Avenue, or Murrell Road.
- Signs are not to be posted on trees, utility poles, street signs, public signage, or existing signs, and will not be placed at a corner lot to interfere with vehicle operator visibility.
- NO balloons, flags, pennants, or signs on vehicles.
