The Three A's of Holiday Crime Prevention



Pe AWARE of Your Surroundings, Be ALERT to Suspicious People and Vehicles, AVOID Dangerous Situations.

- Is it absolutely necessary to carry a purse at all times? A wallet or credit card in a pocket would be less tempting.
- Carry only the amount of cash or credit cards that you need.
- Zip or close purse securely to avoid pickpocketers. Carry purse or shoulder-bag in front of you and close to your body. Do not carry spare keys in your purse.
- Keep your purse on your lap when dining or at meetings.
- Avoid carrying a lot of packages; it can make you look defenseless.
- In the supermarket, do not leave your purse in the shopping cart. REMEMBER: Out-of-sight, out-of-mind, out-of-purse!
- Avoid displaying valuables such as jewelry or large sums of money. Also, dress so you can walk or run easily to avoid an attack.
- Do not enter your driveway if a suspicious vehicle has followed you. Go to the nearest safe location, or an area where there are people and call 911. If you are confronted in your driveway, remain in your locked car with your windows up and blow your horn. The distance from your car to your front door is no man's land.
- When using the ATM, make sure that it is not in a secluded location and is well lighted. Also, use the "buddy system." Go directly to your car and count the cash in your vehicle, not at the ATM.
- At home, do not display all your gifts where they can be seen from a window or doorway.
- Going on vacation for the Holidays? Have a friend or family member check on your home and leave emergency contact information with them.
- Be aware of where you are and where you are going at all times. Stay away from a potentially dangerous area or situation.

Trust your instincts. If you suspect something is wrong, or if a situation seems dangerous, you may be right! Don't dismiss suspicious people, cars, or situations. Report them immediately. Call 9-1-1 for EMERGENCY and (321) 690-3988 for NON EMERGENCY.

he Sanitation Division is now one month into the Single Stream Recycling program. Although not enough time has elapsed to do a precise comparison from the previous recycling program, there are already some good results. Compared to 2010, the amount of recycling by weight has increased 69%. There is no significant change in the comparison for garbage by weight. We have a long road ahead in meeting the mandate of 75% total recycling and reducing the household waste stream to 25%, but this is a great start to reaching the goal. Thank you for recycling!

Stop Crime in Its Tracks!

Precautious Communication from the Rockledge Police Department
We realize you work extremely hard for all your possessions; please don't allow anyone to take them without your permission.

Unfortunately, over the past several months, large numbers of Rockledge residents have encountered vehicle burglaries. Now is the time to stop this cycle. Don't become the next target. A few extra seconds can significantly decrease your chances of becoming the next victim.

- <u>Lock Your Vehicle Doors</u>: the majority of burglaries occur in Rockledge because vehicle
 doors are unsecured. The criminals look for easy access and they are successful when
 residents don't take the time to lock their doors.
- <u>Nothing In Plain View</u>: take the time to remove all valuables from your vehicle every night before you lock up tight. If the criminals can <u>see</u> your valuables, they are going to want to <u>seize</u> your valuables.
- <u>Don't Fall Short To Report</u>: we want to know of every crime. Even if nothing was removed from your vehicle, but you notice it's not the way "you" left it, report this unlawful intent to the Rockledge Police. Your information can give us the "missing link" to other related crimes.
- Be A Good Witness: if you notice something/someone suspicious or unusual in your area, please notify the Rockledge Police immediately. We highly rely on your information to give us the "jump on the case". We are more successful with your active participation. Please assist us so we can better assist you.
- Remember: most vehicle burglaries occur during the late evening or early morning hours, when the criminal assumes you are unaware. Let's show the "bad guys" it's not safe to assume and Rockledge residents are fully aware of how to "batten down the hatches".

Stormwater Monitoring at Barton Park

The City of Rockledge, in concert with Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP), Camp Dresser McKee (CDM) Engineering, and Flowers Community Lab are



proceeding with the monitoring program associated with Barton Park Stormwater Facility. The monitoring of the 774-acre basin will evaluate the effectiveness of pollutant load removal for the next twelve to eighteen months. The receiving body for this treatment facility is the Indian River Lagoon, which is being monitored as a National Estuary for Total Maximum Daily Loads (TMDLs) that mandates a reduction in Nitrogen and Phosphorus pollutant contributors.

Building Permits are for Your Protection

ny homeowner will tell you "there is always something I want to do to my house!" In the current economic environment, many homeowners are planning to renovate, remodel, add an addition, or have other work done to their existing home. Building permits from the Rockledge Building Division are required to ensure that construction meets the requirements of all state, city, zoning and fire prevention codes. Inspections are conducted on all permits to ensure the safety and welfare of the citizens of Rockledge.

Most of all, remember that permits and inspections are in place to help protect you as a citizen of Rockledge. If you have any questions or need assistance, please do not hesitate to call the Building Division. Our staff is here to help you! Call us Monday thru Friday, 8am-5pm at 690-3984.

Hire Only Licensed Contractors

If you hire a contractor to do any work, make sure the contractor is properly licensed and insured as required by Florida Statutes. Essentially, if you pay someone to construct a building or a structure, make structural alterations, or perform services such as plumbing or air conditioning work, for example, that person has to have a state contractor's license. Other types of work may require licensing at the local level. By hiring a licensed contractor, you will have peace of mind knowing that the project will be done by someone who has taken the time to acquire that appropriate education and the proper workers compensation and/or liability insurance and who possesses the necessary experience. It is extremely important to be cautious when contracting for home improvements and storm repairs. Educate yourself, become an informed consumer, and protect yourself from dishonest persons who will use your misfortune to their advantage.

In addition, pulling an Owner/Builder permit can be Risky Business! If you do not intend to do the work yourself and have been asked by someone without a contractor's license to pull the permit, you are at risk of financial harm. In addition, Section 489.103 (7), Florida Statues, has specific requirements and conditions in order to pull an Owner/Builder permit. Rockledge Says Goodbye to Schultz and Stuart

Rockledge recently closed another chapter in its rich 124+ year history when a crowded assembly bade a fond farewell to long-time mayor Larry L. Schultz. Schultz served as Mayor for 12 years after serving as Seat #1 Councilman for 21 years. Just before the end of his tenure at 7:41 p.m. on November 16, 2011, several dignitaries from throughout Florida, as well as Rockledge notables, joined Councilman Dick Blake in a comical, sometimes side-splitting sendoff as they shared stories of their public service relationships with Larry Schultz. Often referred to as a 'Rocket Scientist', Larry received accolades from Florida League of Cities Executive Director Mike Sittig, FLC Deputy Executive Director Patty Hilaman, current FLC President and Altamonte Springs Mayor Patricia Bates, Oviedo City Councilman Keith Britton, former Rockledge Councilmen Robert A. Anderson and Kendall T. Moore, and on behalf of the City Council and the Executive Staff, City Manager Jim McKnight. With his departure, Larry takes with him more than three decades of service to the citizens of Rockledge, a legendary career etched with pride in his hometown, dignity in his persona, wisdom in his decisions, patience in his guidance, and leadership that knows no bounds, from Rockledge to Brevard County to the State of Florida and beyond.

In another page turned, there remains a shorter chapter, albeit equally as poignant – that of Colleen M. Stuart. Colleen served the citizens of Rockledge as a member of the City Council in Seat #3 for five years, the past two as Council Chair/Deputy Mayor, after being appointed in May 2005 by the then-City Council. Remarkably enough, Colleen served on the City Council without ever having to campaign for her seat, a fact that some might see as confidence in her ability and satisfaction with her service, undoubtedly traits recognized by the City Council that appointed her in the first place. Her prior service rested with the Planning Commission, where her membership spanned nearly a decade.

We tip our hats to both of these outstanding Rockledge leaders, and wish them the best in their new role as "resident" and in their future endeavors.

NEWS & NOTES FROM THE COMMUNITY REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY

In 2002, City Council established the Rockledge Community Redevelopment Agency to advance revitalization of the City's specially designated redevelopment district through public investments and public-private partnerships, resulting in a more inviting area in which the private sector will want to actively invest. This is accomplished, in large part, to building community, enhancing the aesthetic nature of the City and the redevelopment district, and hosting a number of signature events to bring people back to the heart of Rockledge!

Rockledge Community Garden

he first-ever Rockledge Community Garden is in full bloom! The Community Redevelopment Agency began exploring the possibility of implementing a community garden in 2010, and the property at 889 Barton Boulevard was identified because of its strategic location in the heart of the Rockledge Community Redevelopment District. "The benefits of a community garden are many," said Redevelopment Specialist Lisa Nicholas. "Not only do community gardens beautify an area, but they also teach self-reliance and foster friendships and a feeling of camaraderie within the garden and ultimately the entire community." Established in late August 2011, the Community Garden's 26 plots are currently filled, and a waiting list is being maintained. There is an annual membership fee of \$45. Rockledge Farmers Market

In an effort to serve its customers better, the weekly Rockledge Farmers Market, held every Thursday, moved to its new location in the parking area at Rockledge City Hall in early November. "Relocating the weekly farmers market just makes sense," said City Manager Jim McKnight. "We will be able to accommodate additional vendors, offer a wider variety of products to the market's patrons, and provide convenient and accessible parking." In addition to relocating, the Thursday markets will also be operating under new hours – 11 a.m. to 6 p.m. – to provide shoppers with an opportunity to stop by and pick up items after work. While the Rockledge Farmers Market will continue to evolve, current items offered for sale include gourmet coffees, homemade baked goods, homegrown produce, orchids and other plants, spices and sauces, and unique gift items. n Feb. 4 and 5, 2012, the Rockledge Community Redevelopment Agency will sponsor the Fourth Annual Art and Craft show. Boasting nearly 80 vendors, the show draws craftsmen from near and far, and criteria for vendor admission into the show are high, ensuring that attendees will find unique, one-of-a-kind gifts, art and more. On Saturday, the show is held in conjunction with the city's "Cruise-On-In" car show, where a great number of classic cars line Barton Boulevard opposite exhibitors.

"This event gets better every year," said City Manager Jim McKnight. "This will be our fourth show, and we continue to make improvements and fine tune the details based on feedback we receive from our exhibitors and the community. We want to do whatever we can to make both our vendors and attendees feel welcome and at home," McKnight said. The show will run on Saturday, Feb. 4, from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., and on Sunday, Feb. 5, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. In addition to the classic car show on Saturday, there will be food vendors and other entertainment. The public is welcomed to attend, and admission is free!
