Two companies responded with complete and timely quotes:

- Viking Fence & Deck, Inc. \$116,342.00

Staff recommends awarding the project to East Coast Fence & Guardrail, Inc.

**BACKGROUND:** The “Clean Water Act” requires that all wastewater treatment facilities that are permitted to discharge into the lagoon meet advanced wastewater treatment (AWT) standards by July 1, 2025.

The City previously solicited RFQs for Progressive Design-Build firms to achieve the AWT standards. At a previous meeting, Council authorized the selection of Wharton Smith, Inc./Tetra Tech, and a contract was negotiated and executed.

The project is broken into three (3) phases: Phase 1A – Field Sampling & Alternatives Evaluation; Phase 1B – Design, Permitting and Guaranteed Maximum Pricing Development; and Phase 2 – Construction and Commissioning.

In April 2025, the City Council approved a contract with Wharton-Smith and Tetra Tech for Phase 1A of a Progressive Design Build method to achieve the second portion of AWT standards. Phase 1A is now complete.

Over the past several weeks, negotiations were conducted with assistance from the City’s consultant, Jacobs Engineering Group. The final product is presented for Council’s approval.

This item is for consideration of the project proposal and fees for Phase 1B –Design, Permitting, and GMP Development. This phase is estimated to take approximately 16 months.

**BACKGROUND:** Each year, the City budgets funds for street paving, and funds have been budgeted in Fiscal Year 2026 to mill (if recommended), pave, and stripe the Fairway Estates Subdivision and Phase 2 of the Kings Grant Subdivision.

Three quotes were solicited from local paving companies:

Staff recommends that the City Council award the Kings Grant Subdivision resurfacing project to VA Paving, Inc. and award the Fairway Estates resurfacing project to Goodson Paving, Inc.
